DRAFT City of Silver Lake Regular Session Minutes Monday, January 20, 2025

The Governing Body of the City of Silver Lake met in regular session at City Hall on January 20, 2025, at 5:30 PM with Mayor Jonah Bishop conducting the meeting and the following Councilmembers present: Joe Blubaugh, Brad Bryant, Jake Fisher, Michael Hamilton and Kenneth Wade (5) absent: (0). Also present was City Attorney Todd Luckman, Police Chief Doug Ashcraft, City Clerk Marie Beam and Assistant Clerk Sarah Glenn.

A motion was made by Councilmember Bryant to approve the minutes of the January 8, 2025 meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Wade and carried.

Claim vouchers in the amount of \$33,133.26 were submitted to Council for appropriation. Clerk Beam made a note of an emergency expenditure approved by Mayor Bishop of \$1,920.00 for generator repairs. A motion was made by Councilmember Wade and seconded by Councilmember Fisher that said Appropriation Ordinance be accepted as read and passed by a roll call vote of Aye: Joe Blubaugh, Brad Bryant, Jake Fisher, Michael Hamilton and Kenneth Wade (5) Nay: (0). The Ordinance was declared passed and numbered 2624.

Mayor Bishop made a request to have an executive session added to the agenda. Councilmember Wade made the motion which was seconded by Councilmember Hamilton and passed with all ayes.

Councilmember Hamilton made a motion to approve a liquor license renewal for local restaurant, La Victoria. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Bryant and passed with all ayes.

The Insurance Renewal discussion from the previous meeting was reviewed with Attorney Luckman present. With no motion to bid out insurance in 2025 Council moved to the next business item.

Police Chief Ashcraft presented bids to get decals for the new police vehicle. He also asked for Council's input of the color of the badge decal. Council as well as Chief Ashcraft preferred the gold logo. Councilmember Fisher made a motion to accept a bid from Knox Signs and Graphics not to exceed \$1,100.00. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Wade and carried.

Councilmember Wade made a motion that the City Council (along with Mayor Bishop, City Attorney Luckman and the City Clerks) recess into executive session for 10 minutes to discuss non-elected personnel matters pursuant to the non-elected personnel exemption K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1) specifically regarding employee performance. The open meeting will resume at City Hall at 5:55 PM. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Bryant and carried.

The public meeting reconvened at 5:55 PM.

Councilmember Blubaugh made a motion to approve a raise of \$2,200.00 annually for Public Works Superintendent Deiter. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Hamilton and the motion carried.

Chief Ashcraft thanked the Public Works Department for their help with the flooding inside the old police building due to a waterline break.

Councilmember Blubaugh reported that the City will not be able to access any emergency funds regarding the recent blizzard.

Councilmember Hamilton requested an update of the state of the generator for pump station #3. Mayor Bishop let Hamilton know that he is meeting the Public Works Department as well as High Plains Power Systems to discuss repairing the generator instead of replacement.

Councilmember Wade asked for Council's thoughts on a mutual aid agreement with other small towns for non-police matters. Attorney Luckman recommended the City used unofficial mutual aid agreements versus written agreements. Mayor Bishop discussed an agreement with the school as well as all the great citizens that came together to help clean up after the recent blizzard.

With no further business to come before Council, Councilmember Fisher made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:01 PM. Councilmember Bryant seconded the motion, and with no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned.

Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 2620 is hereby amended to read as follows:

THIRD AMENDMENT TO ANTENNA SITE LEASE

This Third Amendment to Antenna Site Lease ("Third Amendment") is made, and shall be effective, as of the last date of the signatures below ("Effective Date"), between CITY OF SILVER LAKE ("Lessor"), and TOPEKA CELLULAR TELEPHONE COMPANY, INC. ("Lessee"). Lessor and Lessee (or their predecessors in interest) entered into that certain Antenna Site Lease dated June 5, 2000, as may have been previously amended and/or assigned, (the "Lease"), pursuant to which Lessee is leasing or licensing from Lessor a portion of that certain property located at the Silver Lake Water Tower, Silver Lake, Kansas, as more particularly described in the Lease. Lessor and Lessee may be referenced in this Third Amendment individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

In consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained in this Third Amendment, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties agree to amend the Lease as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> Notwithstanding anything contained in the Lease to the contrary, the Lease shall expire on August 31, 2025. Commencing on September 1, 2025, the Lease shall be extended for 5 years ("Initial Extension Term"). The term of the Lease shall thereafter automatically extend for 1 additional term of 5 years (an "Additional Extension Term"), unless Lessee terminates the Lease by giving Lessor notice of such termination at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the Initial Extension Term or then-current Additional Extension Term.
- 2. Rent. Commencing on September 1, 2025, the monthly rent during the Initial Extension Term shall be \$2,400.00 to be paid on the first day of the month in advance to Lessor or such other person as Lessor may designate in writing at least 30 days in advance of any rental payment date. Thereafter, commencing on September 1, 2030, monthly rent for the Additional Extension Term shall increase by 10% upon commencement of the Additional Extension Term.
- 3. Rent Credit. This Third Amendment provides for a reduction in rent, effective September 1, 2025. The Parties acknowledge and agree that Lessee shall be entitled to a credit in the event of any overpayment of rent resulting from said reduction in rent. Such credit shall be applied against Lessee's rent due under the Lease.
- 4. Right of First Refusal. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Lease to the contrary, if at any time after the Effective Date, Lessor receives an offer or letter of intent, from any person or entity that is in the business of owning, managing or operating communications facilities or is in the business of acquiring landlord interests in agreements relating to communications facilities, to purchase fee title, an easement, a lease, a license, or any other interest in the Property or any portion thereof or to acquire any interest in the Lease, or an option for any of the foregoing, Lessor shall provide written notice to Lessee of said offer ("Lessor's Notice"). Lessor's Notice shall include the prospective buyer's name, the purchase price being offered, and any other consideration being offered, the other terms and conditions of the offer, a description of the portion of and interest in the Property and/or the Lease which will be conveyed in the proposed transaction, and a copy of any letters of intent or form agreements presented to Lessor by the third-party offeror. Lessee shall have the right of first refusal to meet any bona fide offer of sale or



transfer on the terms and conditions of such offer or by effectuating a transaction with substantially equivalent financial terms. If Lessee fails to provide written notice to Lessor that Lessee intends to meet such bona fide offer within 60 days after receipt of Lessor's Notice, Lessor may proceed with the proposed transaction in accordance with the terms and conditions of such third-party offer. in which event the Lease shall continue in full force and effect and the right of first refusal described in this Section shall survive any such conveyance to a third party. If Lessee provides Lessor with notice of Lessee's intention to meet the third party offer within 60 days after receipt of Lessor's Notice, then if Lessor's Notice describes a transaction involving greater space than the Antenna Facilities, Lessee may elect to proceed with a transaction covering only the Antenna Facilities and the purchase price shall be prorated on a square footage basis. Further, Lessor acknowledges and agrees that if Lessee exercises this right of first refusal, Lessee may require a reasonable period of time to conduct due diligence and effectuate the closing of a transaction on substantially equivalent financial terms of the third-party offer. Lessee may elect to amend the Lease to effectuate the proposed financial terms of the third party offer rather than acquiring fee simple title or an easement interest in the Antenna Facilities. For purposes of this Section, any transfer, bequest or devise of Lessor's interest in the Property as a result of the death of Lessor, whether by will or intestate succession, or any conveyance to Lessor's family members by direct conveyance or by conveyance to a trust for the benefit of family members shall not be considered a sale for which Lessee has any right of first refusal.

- 6. <u>Continued Effect</u>. Except as amended hereby, all of the other terms and conditions of the Lease shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between any term and provision of the Lease and this Third Amendment, the terms and provisions of this Third Amendment shall control. In addition, except as otherwise stated in this Third Amendment, all initially capitalized terms shall have the same respective defined meaning stated in the Lease. All captions are for reference purposes only and shall not be used in the construction or interpretation of this Third Amendment.
- 7. Ratification and Reaffirmation. Lessor and Lessee do hereby ratify, reaffirm, adopt, contract for and agree to be, or continue to be, bound by all of the terms and conditions of the above-referenced Lease. Except as modified by this Third Amendment, all of the terms and conditions of the Lease are incorporated by reference herein as if set forth at length. It is acknowledged and agreed that the execution of this Third Amendment by the Parties is not



intended to and shall not constitute a release of either Party from any obligation or liability which said Party has to the other pursuant to the Lease.

FARM LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 1st day of March, 2024, by and between The City of Silver Lake, Kansas (hereinafter referred to as "Lessor"), and Wendell Mohler, Dennis Mohler, Jesse Mohler, and Colleen Dougan (hereinafter referred to as "Lessees").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Lessor desires to lease to Lessees and Lessors desire to lease from Lessor the following described real estate:

11.9 acres of farmland located in the North Three-Quarters (N3/4) of the Southwest Quarter (SE/4) of Section Sixteen (16), Township Eleven (11) South, Range Fourteen (14), East of the 6th P.M., Shawnee County, Kansas

together with the improvements thereon (if any), being hereinafter referred to as "Leased Premises".

- **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises, the mutual covenants herein contained, and other valuable considerations, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:
- 1. Term of Lease. Lessor does hereby lease to Lessees and Lessees to hereby lease from Lessor the Leased Premises for the 2024 crop season, which shall be terminated on September 1, 2024; provided, however, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, the Lessees shall have until November 30 of the year of termination to harvest and remove any of the growing crops upon the Leased Premises.
- 2. Rental. The Lessee shall pay to the Lessor as rentals for the Lessed Premises One Thousand Eleven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1,011.50), said amount to be paid upon execution of this Farm Lease Agreement.
- 3. Expenses. Lessees, unless otherwise herein provided for, shall furnish or cause to be furnished all labor and equipment and to pay all costs and expenses for the farming operations on the Leased Premises as herein provided for. It is further agreed that all income received from the farm from the production and sale of crops shall be the property of the Lessee.
- **4. Assignment of Lease.** Lessees shall not assign this Lease or sublet any part of the Leased Premises without prior written consent of the Lessor.
- **5. Binding Effect.** The terms and provisions of this Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, devisees, legatees, trustees, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- 6. Right of Entry. Lessor hereby reserves the right to enter upon said premises at any time for the purpose of reviewing the same or for making repairs, alterations or improvements thereon or for attending to any business matters pertaining to

the farm.

7. **Descriptive Headings.** The descriptive headings of the various sections hereof were formulated and inserted for convenience only and shall not be deemed to affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.
